

## Scripture Scavenger Hunt #3

### The flood covers the earth.

(If you want to explore the entire narrative, read chapters 6-9)

#### Investigate Genesis 6:9-22

How has Adam and Eve's sin affected humanity? (see **Gen. 4:6-10; 4:19-24; 6:5-7**)  
Why does God command Noah to build an ark? Why might Noah hesitate to do this?

#### Navigate Genesis 7:11-24

What will happen to those who don't take refuge from the flood in the ark?  
(see **Gen. 6:17**) Does it surprise you that God would do this? Why or why not?

#### Continue through Genesis 8:13-22

Why does God command Noah to bring two of every kind of animal on the ark, but seven pairs of "clean animals?" (see **Gen. 8:20-21**) What reason does God give for promising to never again destroy every living creature? Does God's judgment change the condition of the human heart? What do you think was God's purpose for the flood?

#### Refer to Hebrews 11:7


What characteristic of Noah led him to obey God and build the ark? On what basis did God declare Noah "righteous?" (see **Gen. 7:1**) Why'd God save Noah and his family? Was he without sin? (see **Gen. 9:20-28**)

#### Go to Genesis 9:12-17

Why does God put a rainbow in the sky? Without this sign, why might God be inclined to flood the earth again? How does this account about Noah teach us that we need more than a "second chance?" Is the rainbow a sign that God will never judge people? (see **Hebrews 9:27**) How do you think Noah felt about God after the flood? (read **9:1**)

#### Examine Matthew 24:37-39

How will the return of Jesus be similar to the flood? What can we learn from Noah about preparing for Christ's return?
